






#### AIRPORT ACTIVITY - FUEL SALES




#### **AIRPORT ACTIVITY - OPERATIONS (TAKE OFFS AND LANDINGS)**











# OEU RESIDENTIAL RATE COMPARISON

#### Electric Residential Rate Comparison March 2019 per 1,000 kWh's















#### Ocala Police Department Amnesty program

- \* Started in February 2018, guaranteed assistance regardless of ability to pay
- \* To date, 68 people have entered the program
- \* Costs roughly \$6,000 per month to treat patients
- \* City donates drug forfeiture money to treatment centers
- \* Recently increased treatment beds from 5 to 15



#### Ocala Skate Park

The City of Ocala will construct a skate park with 10,000 to 20,000-square feet of skate-able surface in Tuscawilla Park. This park will be an asset to skaters, BMX bikers and families as a whole, as it will include green space, bathrooms, walking paths, shade trees, benches, vending machines and public art. The park will be lit for nighttime use.
